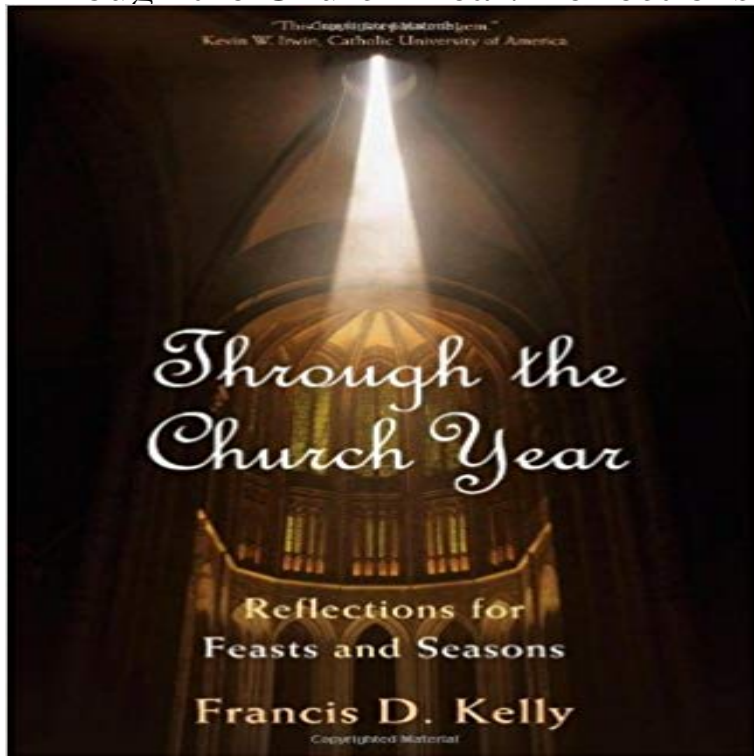


## Through the Church Year: Reflections for Feasts and Seasons
